It has been a positive, proactive and prayerful start to the school year. Year 7 celebrated Mass welcoming them to the school community, planned by the liturgy leads. Over 60 Year 7s put themselves forward to live out their faith in action through the Chaplaincy Team who have started by creating peace prayer doves (see picture) and leading on CAFOD projects. The Eco team (Years 8-13) are supporting the CAFOD campaign on climate action. Charitable missions and heart missions are well underway. Our first call was to collect shoes for the St Nicholas World Development Group, these shoes will be sent to a school in Uganda and help enable children to attend school. Our next mission is to collect warm blankets and warm coats for St. Chad's Sanctuary and Crisis for the homeless in Birmingham.

Teaching & Learning

We are pleased to welcome back our students to a new academic year and we are confident that they will work hard and make the most of each and every lesson. We hope that our new Year 7 and external Sixth form students in Year 12 have settled well.

I would like to encourage parents and guardians to make full use of our school website. The curriculum area is full of useful student resources and information about the topics that students cover and the sequence of their learning. Google Classroom continues to be our on-line learning platform through which home learning is set and resources are shared. Students speak highly of this provision and like the way it operates.

Next half term, there are a number of learning cycles. It is important that students know exactly what is expected of them and which topics to revise. We encourage students to be active in their revision and take part in activities such as self-quizzing, mind map creation and question/ answer flash cards. Please be aware that at Key Stage 3 students should have access to the booklet for that given theme/ topic, glossaries and knowledge organisers (a concise document detailing the most 'powerful information').

Reading, writing and oracy continue to be some of our whole-school teaching and learning priorities this academic year. Through our continued professional development schedule staff have received a lot of information and strategies in order to boost students' aptitude in these fields. We have also introduced the Word of the Week whereby students are introduced to a Tier 2 term and this is explored further in lesson time by looking at its definition and examples of how it can be used in the context of a particular subject discipline.

We recognise the importance of our students being fully equipped for lessons. In order to support this philosophy, we have continued to run our stationery shop in the 'Link' area before school at 8.30am. It sells a wide range of equipment including biros, highlighters, glue sticks, white board pens (essential for the use of the white board in the back of the student planner) and purple pens (required by students to complete self/peer assessment activities). We encourage students to use our non-profit stationery shop to ensure that they are fully equipped for each lesson.

Year 11 Visit to Normandy, France.





On a rainy, dark night on 28th September, 40 Year 11 pupils and four teachers embarked upon a trip to the Château du Baffy in Normandy, France. Whilst there, we experienced some French history, culture and food (including a frogs' legs and snails tasting!). On our way down to the château, we stopped off at the beautiful port of Honfleur where everyone seemed to want to buy a baguette! We later continued on to the Caen Memorial Museum. On the Saturday, we had an excursion to Arromanches-les-Bains, which is next to Gold beach, and where you can see the remains of the Mulberry Harbour, which enabled the continued supply of provisions for the troops following the D-Day landings on 6th June 1944. We also viewed the German aun battery (part of the Atlantic Wall defences) and we later continued on to the American Cemetery at Colleville-sur-Mer which overlooked Omaha beach. There we watched the flag lowering ceremony. We ended the day with a trip to Bayeux, where pupils could visit the impressive cathedral, view the Bayeux tapestry and practise their French conversational skills. Before we departed on Sunday, we laid a wreath at the British Military Cemetery at Bayeux on behalf of Bishop Walsh school. This was a very moving element of the trip and we were fortunate to be able to offer thanks for the sacrifice and service of the men and women who died whilst liberating France from Nazi occupation. It was an amazing experience and all pupils said that they really profited from their first school trip abroad since the pandemic. They were excellent ambassadors for the school and we were really proud of them!

examinations. And we are delighted to announce that 100% of students passed their examinations with Merit or Distinction - an outstanding result. The students showcased huge amounts of determination and talent, and we are immensely proud of every single one of them. For some students, this was their very first exam, for others it was their Gold Medal examination, giving them UCAS (university entrance) points.

Computer Science

Year 11 Cambridge Nationals in IT pupils have been producing some incredible 3D designs in preparation for their coursework, which focuses on augmented reality.

They will be able to superimpose these designs over a user's view of the real world, providing a composite view of both the real world and digital content.

Each of the 3D designs you see here have been produced using a series of individual shapes, which the pupils have manipulated to create their own, unique object.




Figure 1: A ring by Elyssa

Augmented reality is increasingly being used in the retail industry – from seeing whether a new pair of glasses would suit you, to trying out the inside of a new car design to see which style you prefer. It is also a useful tool in the gaming industry and in education, where it can make the classroom more engaging (imagine tapping on a digital image of a famous historical character who seems to be standing at the front of the classroom and finding out about their adventures). AR is limited only by imagination.

It's fantastic that pupils are at the cutting edge and are learning how to create 3D models and are utilising them in AR products!




Figure 4: Notre Dame by Harrison




Figure 3: Tower Bridge by Chinedu

A morning with Motion House





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Macmillan Coffee Morning





We truly appreciate your understanding and assistance in fostering responsibility among our students. Thank you!


